

Glitter Lotion

Description

If you follow this basic recipe you can convert any of Essential Wholesales Lotion Bases into your own Glitter Lotion.

Recipe

8 lbs Any Essential Wholesale Lotion

.2 lbs Cosmetic Glitter

To scent add

.04 to .08 lbs Essential Oil or Fragrance Oil of your choice (.64 oz to 1.28 oz)

Directions

Mix in a stainless steel bowl Essential Wholesale Lotion base with Cosmetic Glitter using a stainless steel spoon. For thorough mixture use a clean stick blender instead of a spoon. If you would like to add scent mix in essential oil or fragrance oil with gentle stirring or short bursts of mixing with stick blender. Finished product should be packaged into bottles or jars. There are several options for packaging your jars. You can spoon finished product into jars, use a funnel or use a clean zip lock bag to package. If you chose to use a zip lock bag simply fill bag with finished crème and snip one corner of the bag to release product. The size of the snip will determine how quickly or slowly the product releases from the bag. If you are packaging into bottles it is simplest to use a funnel. Another great method for packaging lotions is to funnel all of your finished product back into the narrow mouth jug that it arrived in. Once in the jug you can either use a condiment tip (found at restaurant supply stores) or a one gallon pump (available from Essential Wholesale or restaurant supply stores.) If you use the pump simply pump your product straight into your containers. If you use a condiment tip all you need to do is turn the gallon over and use pressure to release product. You can snip the tip to allow for more product to release at one time.

Approximate Yield

15 bottles or jars (8 oz), 20 bottles or jars (6 oz), 30 bottles or jars (4 oz), 60 bottles or jars (2 oz) or 120 (1 oz) bottles or jars.

Equipment

Stainless steel bowl

Stainless steel spoon

Gloves (recommended)

Funnel

Bottles or jars

Alcohol to cleanse all equipment before use

Ingredient List

Add Acrylates Polymer (Cosmetic Glitter) to the ingredient list prior to Tocopherol
